### CURRENT RESEARCH INTERESTS

Social support exchanges in the context of stressful and traumatic life events at both individual (e.g., criminal victimization, unemployment, bereavement) and community (e.g., disasters, acts of terrorism, political crises) levels. Models estimating the role of social support and other resources as moderating and mediating factors in the stress-adjustment process. Determinants of psychological hardiness and resilience (i.e. successful adaptation) of individuals and communities facing a variety of crises, including extreme stress. Cultural influences on helping behavior, social support, and coping with stress. Influence of political events on well-being. Application of social psychological principles (e.g., social cognition, attribution) in examining the course of coping with stressful life events. Mental health concomitants of politics and political behaviors.
